



## Dates

The 15th British Reformed Fellowship (BRF) Family Holiday Conference begins with dinner on Saturday, 21 July, at 6:30 PM and ends after breakfast on Saturday, 28 July (DV). People may arrive at the conference centre from 2 PM onwards on Saturday, 21 July.

## Programme

The conference will be of a relaxed nature and adequate time will be available for fellowship and various on-site activities, as well as two day trips. The 6 speeches on “The Reformed Family—According to the Word of God” and the special lecture will be delivered in the evenings and some mornings in the main auditorium. There will be 2 worship services on the Lord’s Day (22 July). The 14th Biennial General Meeting of the BRF will also take place.

## Venue ([www.hebronhall.org](http://www.hebronhall.org))

Set in 7½ acres of grounds, Hebron Hall Christian Centre is located on the outskirts of the village of Dinas Powys, only four miles southwest of Cardiff (complete with Cardiff Castle, Welsh Assembly, Millennium Stadium, etc.), within the beautiful Vale of Glamorgan. Hebron Hall is just a few miles from the coast (e.g., Barry and Penarth) and Cardiff Bay, a freshwater lake separated from the sea by a barrage.

## Travel

- *By air:* The nearest major airports are Cardiff Airport (CWL) and Bristol Airport (BRS). Hebron Hall is approximately 10 minutes drive from Cardiff Airport and 1 to 1½ hours drive from Bristol Airport. Taxis are available from Cardiff Airport to Hebron Hall. From Bristol Airport, you can take buses or a bus/train combination to Cardiff and then to Dinas Powys ([www.uk.megabus.com](http://www.uk.megabus.com), [www.nationalexpress.com](http://www.nationalexpress.com) or [www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk)). Within the British Isles or Europe, there are discount airlines that fly into Cardiff and/or Bristol ([www.easyjet.com](http://www.easyjet.com), [www.ryanair.com](http://www.ryanair.com), [www.flybe.com](http://www.flybe.com), [www.bmibaby.com](http://www.bmibaby.com) – note luggage allowances).
- *By rail:* Hebron Hall is just a short walk from the Dinas Powys train station. Trains run frequently from Cardiff Centre to Dinas Powys.
- *By road:* Hebron Hall is only a few miles south of Junction 33 of the M4 ([www.hebronhall.org/directions.php](http://www.hebronhall.org/directions.php)).

## Day Trips by Coach

Day Trip 1: £5 (0-16 years), £10 (adult) – includes admission to the castle

- *Raglan Castle* - built in the 1430s, and besieged and captured by the parliamentary forces in 1646 during the English Civil War. It is still a substantial castle and even has a moat ([www.cadw.gov.wales/daysout/raglancastle/?lang=en](http://www.cadw.gov.wales/daysout/raglancastle/?lang=en)).
- *Gloucester* - a historic city to explore on your own, including the sites where the English Reformer, John Hooper, preached and was martyred (1555), plus Hillfield Gardens, the 200-year-old prison, the historic docks, cathedral, etc. ([www.thecityofgloucester.co.uk](http://www.thecityofgloucester.co.uk)).

Day Trip 2: FREE (0-16 years), £5 (adult) – St. Fagan’s charges no admission fee

- *St. Fagan’s National Museum of History* – one of Europe’s leading open-air museums and Wales’s most popular heritage attraction. The museum is vast. Explore the living spaces that people once enjoyed (or endured), getting a good idea of what it was like to live in Wales from the time of the Celts to the present day. Besides a large variety of dwelling places, there are also carefully reconstructed farms, a church, shops, a workman’s club, a tannery, farmyard animals, an indoor museum, a café, etc. ([www.museum.wales/stfagans](http://www.museum.wales/stfagans)).

## On-site Activities ([www.hebronhall.org/leisurefacilities.php](http://www.hebronhall.org/leisurefacilities.php))

Hebron Hall has an indoor, 20 metre, heated swimming pool which will be available at set times. There is an indoor sports hall for 5-a-side football, volleyball, basketball, etc. Two outdoor tennis courts are available for those who bring their own racquets and balls. There is also an indoor games room with pool, snooker and table-tennis.

## Other Amenities

- Children’s crèche room.
- Free wireless internet access in designated areas of the centre.
- Laundry facilities are available on request for an additional charge.
- High chairs and cots for infants are available free of charge. Please indicate on the booking form if you need a cot.

- All accommodation is full board, and includes bedding and towels.
- There are some single rooms, a few ground floor disabled rooms and 15 places for those in non en suite rooms. All are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

## Prices (all full board, including bedding and towels)

Standard en suite: £45 (0-4), £195 (5-11), £310 (12-16), £350 (adult).

Single en suite: £400.

Standard non en suite: £45 (0-4), £170 (4-11), £290 (12-16), £330 (adult).

Single non en suite: £380.
